All school meals follow the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) guidelines for health school meals. Studies have shown that children who eat breakfast and lunch perform better in school. By providing breakfast and lunch to all students at no charge, we are hoping to create a better learning environment for our students.

The Hapeville Charter school breakfast and lunch programs cannot succeed without your support, so please encourage your student to participate by eating breakfast and lunch.

All Hapeville Charter student qualify for breakfast and lunch at no charge under the USDA Seamless Summer program for the 2021-2022 school year. This also means that Hapeville Charter will **not** be collecting Free and Reduced Meal applications this school year.

- Breakfast is served from 7:45 AM to 8:30 AM (grab and go breakfast will be available after 8:30 AM)
- Lunch is served between 11:30 AM – 1:25 AM
